International Tour - Eastern Region



Long Tour begins at 5pm September 11 in Minneapolis

The long tour starts with a welcome reception at the Hampton Inn & Suites Downtown in St. Paul, MN at 5 pm on Friday, September 11. Guests should plan to fly into the Minneapolis Airport (MSP) and may take a Ride Share (Lyft or Uber), taxi, or a direct bus departing from MSP Terminal 1 Transit Station arriving at 7th St W & Chestnut St. Bus services depart every 20 minutes and operate daily. The journey is less than a half hour.

Short Tour begins at 6pm September 17 in Chicago



The short tour officially begins the morning of Friday September 18. Attendees are encouraged to fly into Chicago O'Hare International Airport (ORD) before 6pm Central Time on Thursday, September 17 to part take in the group dinner. There is a direct train departing from O'Hare and arriving at Clark and Lake Street. Services depart every 10 minutes and operate daily. Alternatively, guests may hire a Ride Share (Lyft or Uber) or a Taxi for a short 20-minute journey to the host hotel.

Both the long and short tours will finish at the conclusion of the IPPS Eastern Region conference in Grand Rapids, MI at 12:30 pm on Friday, September 25. Guests may travel on their own to General R. Ford International Airport (GRR) in Grand Rapids or find transportation to either the Detroit Airport (DTW) or back to Chicago to O'Hare (ORD).

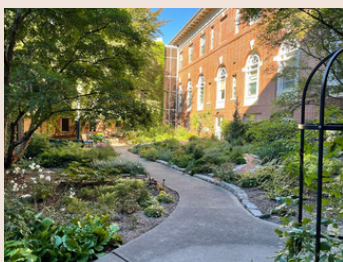

University of Wisconsin Arboretum: Established in 1933, the 1,240-acre UW Arboretum is the birthplace of ecological restoration and home to the world's first prairie restoration. Its crown jewel, the 37-acre Longenecker Horticultural Gardens, features Wisconsin's most diverse collection of woody plants, including nationally significant lilacs, crabapples, magnolias, and conifers. The Arboretum also showcases the Wisconsin Native Plant Garden, a beautifully designed 4-acre landscape highlighting hundreds of native species.

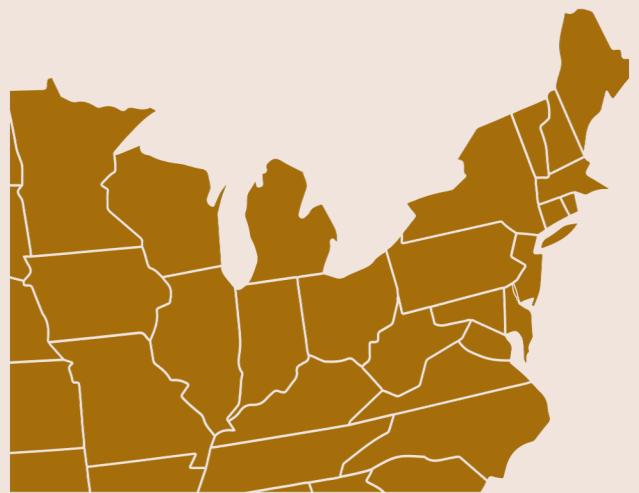

EASTERN REGION FACTS

Amid a sea of people, the Eastern Region represents vital islands of green within the most geographically, ecologically, and socially diverse part of the United States. Spanning 20 states and home to more than 43% of the nation's population, it is the country's most urbanized region. Within these boundaries, 57 sites have been identified as candidate or potential Research Natural Areas (RNAs), currently in various stages of review for possible establishment.

The Eastern Region is very rich in biological diversity and harbor 605 Regional Forester Sensitive Plants and 13 federally threatened or endangered plants.



There are currently 51 established Research Natural Areas in the North Central and Northeastern states.

Facts about the Eastern Region

- The Eastern Region is rich in water with over 10,000 lakes, 15,000 miles of streams, and 2 million acres of wetlands. The 12 million acres of national forest system lands are among the largest contiguous blocks of public lands.
- Community types include: boreal forests; tall grass prairie; pine barrens; shoreline along three Great Lakes; central hardwood forests; glades; bogs; Appalachian foothills; the White Mountains; some of the most extensive virgin forests in the eastern U.S., and so much more.
